Jane Knott Hungerford joins the Canada Science and Technology Museums Corporation's Board of Trustees

Ms. Hungerford was a founding member of Science World (now TELUS World of Science) Vancouver from 1987 to 1994. She has also served 15 years on the board of the BC Cancer Foundation, including five years as Chair.

Ms. Hungerford has been the recipient of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II Diamond and Golden Jubilee Medals. She is a Dame of Grace in the Sovereign Order of St. John of Jerusalem, and a recipient of the Lions Club International Medal of Merit.
